# Our Role in Communication and Engagement in West Wales

Regional Partnership Boards must ensure that all partners including health services, local councils and some other organisations work effectively together to improve health outcomes for people in their region. They must ensure that services and resources are used in the most effective and efficient way to meet the care and support needs of people in their region.

Every five years the RPB develops a Population assessment for West Wales (<u>wwrpb.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/Population-Needs-Assessment-revision-V2-FINAL-v3-Accessible-FINAL.pdf</u>), followed by a regional Area Plan that is based on these findings (<u>Area Plan – West Wales Regional Partnership Board (wwrpb.org.uk</u>)).To ensure that the care and support services are developed in response to the needs identified, it is essential to engage with and reflect the voice of people with lived experience. Our continuous engagement approach ranges from input from the long-standing and informal Dream Team, who focus on LD and neurodiversity, to the newest group, the Citizen and third Sector Engagement Board, amongst others.



To develop robust processes for monitoring, improving and reporting performance, the WWRPB Team facilitates meetings and events that bring together a range of partners to collaborate on service development and share learning. Some events, such as the Annual Conference in March, (<u>Conference and Awards 2024 – West Wales Regional Partnership Board (wwrpb.org.uk)</u>) cover a range of topics and population groups, whilst others throughout the year are developed around specific priorities of the RPB.

Since April, the team has delivered the launch of the regional Advocacy Strategy, a Dementia -End of Life Conference, workshops for Regional Integration Fund performance and reporting and workshops to develop the regional approach to NEST, all of which have included input and support from project leads and services across the public, private and third sectors.

Each year, we work closely with our team and partners to create an Annual Report showcasing the impact and achievements of everyone who contributes to the work overseen by RPB



## Meet Michael and Nikeela

In 2014, Michael became a Business Support and Finance Officer for the Mid & West Wales Health and Social Care Collaborative, now known as West Wales Partnership Board. His role was later expanded to include communication responsibilities.

Originally from South London, he aspired to become an Architect but shifted to accountancy, starting as a bookkeeper for a Building Company in South-West London and progressing after a few financial roles in the public and private sectors, to a Management Accountant at Lazard London. After redundancy, Michael worked in an Interventions team at the Young Offenders Institute Isis, organizing accredited offender behaviour programs for young offenders' rehabilitation. Later in Wales, he moved into administrative and compliance roles organising and delivering accredited training courses for individuals with LD & pan disabilities. Grateful for the invaluable experience

gained from working alongside talented and dedicated colleagues over the years, Michael says their commitment and expertise has shaped his professional growth.

Passionate about photography & videography, he captures key moments at a variety of events, including sporting moments with stars like LeBron James and Usain Bolt in 2009. Michael believes each image or video clip contributes to a broader story, creating a powerful, immersive experience.



Nikeela joined the WWRPB in May 2023 as a Project Manager. In this role, she provides project management support to both the internal team and external partners. A key part of her position is focused on the WWRPB's external communications, ensuring that its work and impact are communicated to a wider audience.

Part of Nikeela's role when she first joined the team was to recruit individuals with lived experience onto the WWRPB main board meeting and its workstreams. The role as a lived experience representative typically lasts two years and involves being in a corporate environment. This could be challenging for those not used to attending large-scale meetings.

To make the role more accessible and inclusive, we have created a new platform called the Citizen and Third Sector Engagement Board. This board welcomes new members all year-round and serves as a starting point for individuals interested in contributing to the WWRPB.

From the Engagement Board, we will identify suitable candidates to participate in the main WWRPB meeting. This approach ensures that people can engage at a level that best suits their availability and interests.

We will apply the same principle to our workstreams, such as dementia and carers, offering multiple entry points for involvement.

If you do decide to take up a role on a workstream or the board meeting you do not have to attend the engagement board meetings as well, it's completely up to you how much you want to be involved in the WWRPB.

#### Citizen and Third Sector Representative



We have now hosted three meetings of the citizen and third sector representatives board. It was fantastic to see so many people sharing their experiences of health and social care.

The meetings so far have focused on:

- Attendees' roles in the WWRPB and the importance of continuous engagement in regional health and social care projects and services.
- A consultation about how neurodiverse aware West Wales is. (Report Available)
- The WWRPB Capital Team Health and Social Care Hwbs blueprint planning and a briefing on https://carerssupportwestwales.org/

These meetings will be monthly for the first 6 months and bi-monthly thereafter. Its an opportunity to get involved with all aspects of the WWRPB work and share your experiences of health and social care in West Wales.

Adults (CWMPAS) Service User Representative Recruitment Advert



Are you an adult with lived experience of safeguarding services, living in Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion, Pembrokeshire or Powys whom can offer an informed perspective on the quality and delivery of Safeguarding services in the Mid and West Wales region? The Mid and West Wales Regional Safeguarding Board for Adults (CWMPAS), is looking to recruit a service user representative to be a member of its Regional Executive Adult Board. This will be a pilot exercise over a 1 year fixed term period. Your role will ensure the perspective and voice of adults at risk is represented and considered in the business of the Board and your lived experience informs strategic objectives and plans.

Your role and responsibilities will include:

- To attend approximately four Regional Safeguarding Board meetings per year (virtual attendance can be facilitated).
- To attend other relevant regional meetings as appropriate and as agreed between you and the Chair.
- To adequately prepare for Regional Safeguarding Board meetings by reading board papers and agenda in advance of the meeting.
- To maintain the confidentiality of agenda papers, discussion and decisions made. To provide a service user perspective to the business of the Regional Safeguarding Board.
- To contribute to the development of plans and proposals, providing constructive input from a service user perspective.
- To provide a link between the Regional Safeguarding Board and other service users where appropriate.

You will report to the Regional Safeguarding Board Chair and will receive direct support from the Strategic Regional Safeguarding Manager for Children and Adults at Risk. Full Reimbursement of reasonable expenses can be claimed.

Applications are invited by way of a covering letter to the Mid and West Wales Regional Safeguarding Board Chairs Michael Gray and Jake Morgan. Please ensure this includes, your motivation for applying, your lived experience as a service user of safeguarding services and how you feel you can contribute to the Regional Safeguarding Board and its development and response to Adults at risk in Mid and West Wales. The role will require a basic DBS check to be undertaken. The closing date for applications will be Friday 13th September 2024


The WWRPB attended one of their events that took place in August and will provide an update in the next newsletter.
