# What is advocacy?

The role of the advocate is to help people communicate with an effective voice, enabling them to influence decisions that affect their lives. An advocate acts with or on behalf of another person to establish or promote that person's rights.

The Citizen and Third Sector Engagement Board welcomed Kevin (Prevention Programme and Change Manager) and Peggy (3 CIPA) to the board meeting on the 22nd April to

highlight the importance of advocacy and feedback what can be done to share this information around the region.



1 - The diagram , produced by the Golden Thread Advocacy Project, illustrates the spectrum of advocacy provision.

Advocacy comes in many forms, and it's vital to raise awareness that help is available for those who need it. We all share a responsibility in connecting people with the advocacy support they may find valuable.

In West Wales, 3 CIPA are a partnership of experienced and qualified advocates who are commissioned by the three local authorities in Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion and Pembrokeshire to provide Independent Professional Advocacy in Welsh or English across the three counties. They have been recognised for the excellence of their service provision by the award of the quality performance mark (QPM) for advocacy services.

## West Wales Communication and Engagement Drop-In

This is a monthly informal West Wales Communications and Engagement Drop-in. A meeting open to the public sector, private organisations, third sector organisations and support groups (with over 100 members!). The meeting has a recurring agenda, with the aim to reduce duplication and improve communication and engagement across the region. The agenda includes:

# HDUHB Community Pharmacy UTI (Urinary Tract Infections) testing and treatment service

This pilot from Hywel Dda University Health Board was apart of the Bevan Exemplars programme . The service was brought into national commissioning in June last year and has delivered 12,000 consultations across Wales in 10 months with approximately 50% of pharmacies across Wales offering the service. The service will become a mandatory part of CAS from October.

The Bevan Exemplars kindly let us share their pilot write up with you (data taken from 2022):

A community pharmacy based UTI (Urinary Tract Infections) testing & treatment service which would support medical practices, NHS 111, GP Out of Hours (OOH) and potentially MIU units with presentations of patients that have uncomplicated lower urinary tract infections, by offering a means of referral to participating pharmacies.

This service is currently not available as an enhanced service in Wales. There are private services available which are paid for by the patient which can be costly and not always convenient as there are only a very small number of pharmacies who offer the service.

over 1,200 patients, with 71% saying they would otherwise have needed a GP appointment.

This translates to:

- an estimated 1,300 appointments saved and;
- £34,802 in cost savings annually for the health board demonstrating a clear win for patient access and NHS efficiency.

The potential impact if scaled across Wales is significant:

freeing up around 10,400 GP appointments and saving an estimated £285,555 per year.

Time Out for Carers Fund is now open to applications, with revenue funding of up to £4,000 towards projects offering short breaks for unpaid carers in Pembrokeshire until March 2026.

The fund aims to increase the availability and accessibility of short breaks and to support projects providing personalised breaks for unpaid carers in Pembrokeshire by funding the voluntary community sector & Town/ Community Councils to develop creative ideas to support carers to take breaks from caring.

## Get up to 30 hours of funded child care! - Check if you're eligible.



A message from one of our partners:

The Welsh Government's Childcare Offer for Wales means that many parents of 3 to 4 year olds can receive help with childcare costs.

This means 30 hours of early education (also referred to as nursery education) and childcare in Wales for eligible parents. The 30 hours is made up of a minimum of 10 hours of early education a week and a maximum of 20 hours a week of childcare.

This is usually from the term after the child's third birthday, until they are eligible to receive a full-time education (school) place - usually the September after their fourth birthday


