What is a short break? The Welsh Government says that a short break is: 'Any break, which strengthens and/or sustains informal caring relationships and enhances the wellbeing of carers and the people they support. This may be achieved through a service, an activity or an item.' A short break doesn't have to be a holiday. It can be anything that gives you a chance to recharge - whether it's pursuing a hobby, going for a walk, spending time with friends, or even just enjoying a hot cup of tea in peace.

As well as receiving funding from Welsh Government's Amser fund, Carers Trust Crossroads West Wales are pleased to be working in partnership with Pembrokeshire County Council and Carmarthenshire County Council to deliver their Short Breaks Programme to support unpaid carers to access flexible short breaks to support their wellbeing.

## Celebrating Carers Week with a Focus on Short Breaks

As part of this year's Carers Week celebrations, we're excited to welcome Caroline, our new Short Breaks Carer Officer, to HaverHub on Friday 13th June. Caroline will be on hand throughout the event to talk to unpaid carers about the short breaks support available through the Carers Support Pembrokeshire service.

Caroline's role will focus on developing a comprehensive list of short break opportunities across the county, including securing discounts for unpaid carers with local businesses.

In the coming months, we'll also be launching a consultation to find out what types of breaks or offers carers in Pembrokeshire would most value. A survey will be sent out to carers registered with our service, and the findings will help shape the future of short breaks in Pembrokeshire. We'll follow up with a consultation coffee morning in Milford Haven, giving carers a chance to share their views face-to-face. A key priority for Caroline will be targeting areas of the county with low grant uptake last year, ensuring that carers in every part of Pembrokeshire are aware of, and able to access, the support available to them.

Llywodraeth Cymru Welsh Government

Welsh Government announces extra support for unpaid carers. The Welsh Government has extended funding for unpaid carers, providing £5.25m for 2025-2026.

This includes support for short breaks through the Short Breaks Scheme. It also provides financial help for low-income carers with essential costs like food and bills through the Carers Support Fund. This funding aims to make life easier for carers by providing essential support and giving them the chance to take a well-deserved break.

### **Carer Story**

#### - A Break That Brought Back Joy

In 2023, a single mother of two young daughters faced a life-changing diagnosis that placed unexpected challenges on their family. As she began treatment for an aggressive illness, her daughters, then just 6 and 8, naturally stepped into caring roles at home. Though not carers in the traditional sense, they supported their mum emotionally and practically, navigating responsibilities well beyond their years. By 2025, after a long and difficult period, the family was finally able to take a well-deserved break thanks to a grant from Carers Trust, which provided a voucher through lastminute.com. The trip gave them a rare chance to spend quality time together away from hospitals and routines—just a mother and her daughters enjoying each other's company, laughing, shopping, and creating happy memories.

"It was the first time in a long while that the only word on our minds was 'fun'," the mum shared. "We laughed, bonded, and made memories that will last forever. I could see how much my daughters needed this—not just a holiday, but a moment to feel like children again."

The impact of the break has been deeply felt, not just by the children, but by the whole family. The mum credits the experience with lifting their spirits and supporting their emotional well-being. "This voucher gave us hope," she said. "We're truly grateful—for the time away, the chance to smile again, and the reminder that brighter days lie ahead."



#### Government Plans to Reform Welfare Benefits

Carers UK share their concerns regarding the Government's plans to reform the welfare system stating "We are extremely concerned by the proposed changes and the devastating impact they will have on unpaid carers and their families. The Government's plans to tighten eligibility criteria for PIP will mean 150,000 unpaid carers will lose their benefits entitlements by the end of the decade, as PIP is a key 'gateway' benefit for many claiming Carer's Allowance. Families who no longer receive both benefits face losing over £8,000 a year from November 2026".

Carers UK are calling on the Government to immediately reconsider the proposals they have set out and are urging organisations to sign their **open letter** today and join them in calling on the Government to reconsider these proposals and protect carers' incomes! Carers Trust Crossroads West Wales will be joining Carers Trust and Carers UK to lobby for change to protect benefits for carers.

## **Hygiene Waste Collections**

#### \*\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION\*\*

If you care for someone on hygiene waste collections, please help us to make sure only hygiene waste goes into the purple bags. It's important no other waste is included, as the items are processed and recycled into a range of products from notice boards to material for paving more durable roads!

The bags should be used for the following items only:

- Disposable bed pans & liners, incontinence pads, bed and chair pads.
- Colostomy/stoma bags, catheter bags and urine bottles.
- Plastic gloves & disposable aprons.
- · Nappies including any bags & wipes.
- Feeding tubes.

Wherever possible, any items should be emptied, before being bagged. Clinical waste should not be included, this includes items like soiled bandages or swabs. The NHS collect this type of waste via their contractor Natural UK.



Our hygiene collections are fortnightly, and residents can sign up for the service or order more bags via our website:

#### Carmarthenshire

Carers Trust Crossroads West Wales, in partnership with Carmarthenshire County Council, is launching a new Carers Card and Carers Discount Scheme on Monday 9th June 2025, to coincide with National Carers Week.

Unpaid carers in Carmarthenshire can apply for the new card, which comes with two options:



#### **Option A:**

#### **Carers Identification Card**

Provides access to discounts and concessions at participating local businesses.



#### **Option B:**

#### **Carers ID + Emergency Card**

Includes the same discounts plus an emergency response feature that activates a contingency plan through Social Services if the carer is suddenly unable to provide care.



Participating businesses will display a "Carers ID Card Accepted Here" sticker, and discount details can be accessed via a QR code on the card.

Note: Existing Carers Cards remain valid until their expiry date.



Carers Support Pembrokeshire are pleased to launch a NEW Carers Emergency Card and Carers Emergency Back-Up Scheme.



A carer's emergency card is a card that identifies you as a carer and provides emergency contact information. It helps ensure that the person you care for receives support if you are unable to care for them in the case of an accident, unplanned event or family crisis.

### **Carer Recognition Cards**

A Carers Recognition Card is an identification card issued to unpaid carers to acknowledge your caring role and help you to access support and services more easily.

It confirms that the card holder is a carer and provides access to local benefits such as; priority access at certain times (e.g., vaccinations, healthcare), discounts and concessions in a number of local businesses as well as a FREE Pembrokeshire Leisure pass.

### Carers Assessment

In Wales, an unpaid carer's assessment is a legal entitlement under the Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014. It provides carers with the opportunity to discuss their needs and access support to help them in their caring role.

#### What is a Carer's Assessment?

A carer's assessment is a conversation with your local authority to understand:

- The impact of your caring responsibilities on your life.
- The support you need to maintain your own well-being.
- Your goals regarding work, education, and leisure activities.
- Any assistance required to continue caring or to take a break from caring.

This assessment is separate from the needs assessment for the person you care for and can be conducted independently or simultaneously, depending on your preference.

#### Who is Eligible?

Any unpaid carer in Wales who appears to have needs for support is entitled to an assessment. This includes carers of any age, regardless of the amount or type of care provided.

#### How to Request an Assessment

To request a carer's assessment, contact the adult social services department of your local council.

What Support Might Be Offered?

Depending on the assessment, you may be offered information and advice on local support services.

- Access to respite care to give you a break from caring duties.
- Support to help you engage in work, education, or leisure activities.
- Financial support or assistance with benefits.
- The goal is to ensure you have the necessary support to maintain your well-being while fulfilling your caring responsibilities.

  discharge support for carers and family members to ensure a smooth transition from hospital to
  home (Carmarthenshire).
- Money Matters Service help to maximise income, improve budgeting skills, access
  to workshops, access to carer grants, discounts, and concessions (Carmarthenshire,
  Pembrokeshire & Ceredigion).
- Independent Professional Advocacy as part of the 3CIPA Service advising carers of their
  rights, support during assessments and/or care planning reviews, complaints, and safeguarding
  concerns (Carmarthenshire, Pembrokeshire & Ceredigion).
- Time Together Project offering a range of short break options for carers along with wellbeing
  activities for carers and the person they care for (Carmarthenshire & Pembrokeshire).
- FREE Legal Advice Surgeries in partnership with NewLaw Solicitors who offer free confidential advice on issues such as Lasting Power of Attorney, Court of Protection & Deputyship, Will & Trust Funds, Protection of Assets, etc. (Carmarthenshire & Pembrokeshire).
